Also remember that a finished quilt is best, a top is fine and please try to add the binding with that. A lap size quilt (measuring 56” X 60” approximately) with quilting cotton fabrics to make a Finished Quilt or a Top. If you can only make a Top, if you can give the binding with it that would be great. There may be kits from the Comfort Team or sometimes me, just check us out.

Looking forward to more Patriotic Quilts to come. So let’s get those sewing machines humming and SEW ON!!

President’s Quilt Challenge

Due: December 4 ,2023

Mini Quilt – Smaller is Better

The challenge is to make something that is no more than 72 inches around its perimeter....so it could be an 18” square or a rectangle such as 16x20” or something round or oblong if it adds up to 72” or less around its outside border.

i.e.: $18''+18''+18''+18'' = 72''$

$16''+20''+16''+20'' = 72''$

$10''+12''+10''+12''=44''$

$10''+33''+10''+33'' = 86''$ too big

For a circle (Diameter = 22”) $x 3.14 = 69''$

This is a great opportunity to try something you have been thinking about or just a little something extra for a table or wall. Have fun and be creative as you take on this Mini Quilt Challenge.

David Taylor currently lives in Fort Collins, Colorado. His obsession with fabric began at an early age, salvaging tiny scraps from his mother's sewing area trash bin. He started creating on her sewing machine by age 10. After college, he began a 30-plus-year career in graphic design. His first quilt design was in 1999, collaborating on a fundraiser project for Strings Music Festival in Steamboat Springs, CO, with friend Madeleine Vail. Madeleine encouraged him to keep after it. In 2009 he left his job at an advertising agency, started teaching appliqué and quilting, and never looked back. His teaching adventures have taken him around the globe and his quilted artworks hang in numerous private collections.

David Taylor is a two-time recipient of the Master Award for Contemporary Quilting from the International Quilt Association (2006, 2014), the Brother Wall Machine Workmanship Award from the American Quilters Society (Paducah Quilt Week, 2008), and a two-time Best of Show winner at the IQA's Spring Festival in Chicago (2007, 2008).

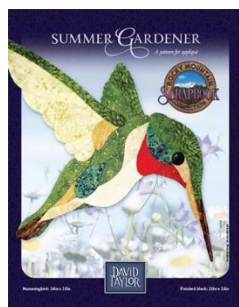

teaching ruler quilt work. Lisa Calle is a long-armed, a Bernina Ambassador and Award-Winning quilter! With her humor and down to earth attitude, she will share with you her personal and professional journey of quilting. Lisa illustrates how she has earned renowned success from her initial

piece using a "3/8" seam allowance, to her latest quilt that won awards at the Houston International Quilt Festival. As you gain insight on Lisa's amazing craft and her 3-step **Divide and Design** method, any hesitation you have regarding the patience or talent for quilting will quickly disappear. So, if you doubt whether you can quilt with pride, Lisa will give you the confidence and knowledge to start.

skill level: intermediate

Do you feel overwhelmed when gazing upon a quilt feeling anxious that something creative and beautiful is beyond your scope? Have you observed pieces designed by quilters and thought "where do they come up with such originality?"

You are not alone, and the cure for such reluctance is just a class away. With Lisa's 3 step process you will approach the idea of quilting in a completely new way. Over the course of this class, you will divide large areas of your quilt into manageable small spaces, gaining the confidence and skill needed to produce a design that will make your quilt top sing and have you smiling with pride! You will soon discover that anyone can transform the everyday quilt into a masterpiece, and moreover turn those special quilts into treasured heirlooms. So do not let Quilter's Agoraphobia keep you from doing what you love; let Lisa's class provide the freedom needed to bring out the quilter in you!
