A caddy is a simple tote with handles that attach to a wheelchair or walker with Velcro. Pick up a kit at our meeting. The completed caddies are brought to local nursing homes. Cell phone, water bottle and a book are common items found in a caddy. Easy to follow directions will guide you as you spend less than one hour sewing a caddy. The challenge is to make something that is no more than 72 inches around its perimeter....so it could be an 18" square or a rectangle such as 16x20" or something round or oblong if it adds up to 72" or less around its outside border.

 10"+12"+10"+12"=44"

10"+33"+10"+33" = 86" too big

For a circle (Diameter = 22") x 3.14 = 69"

## BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Welcome to a brand-new Quilt North guild year and our 2023 - 2024 Block of the Month opportunity! We have four seasonal kits for this year's program and, in a change from previous years, are packaging them together and giving them all to you at the time you sign up and pay for the program.

Our theme this year is 'Seasons of Friendship' and each of the four seasonal kits consists of four pieced 12" finished blocks including two Friendship Star blocks and two original seasonal blocks incorporating smaller friendship stars. That makes a total of 16 blocks for the year. In addition to color diagrams, instructions for the blocks, and pictures of sample blocks, each kit contains the background fabrics for the blocks. White Kona is included for the large Friendship Stars and Sky-Blue Kona for the seasonal blocks. You will need to use scraps and fabrics from your stash to complete your blocks. We had so much fun making our sample blocks and hope you will decide to join in the fun!

The cost is \$25 for the year and there will be a limit of 25 participants. Signup will be first come (and paid), first served starting at the September meeting!

We will be at the BOM table before the meeting and at the break with our sample blocks and to sell the kits! Remember, you will be getting all the kits for the year as soon as you sign up and pay. We look forward to seeing you!

David Taylor currently lives in Fort Collins, Colorado. His obsession with fabric began at an early age, salvaging tiny scraps from his mother's sewing area trash bin. He started creating on her sewing machine by age 10. After college, he began a 30-plus-year career in graphic design. His first quilt design was in 1999, collaborating on a fundraiser project for Strings Music Festival in Steamboat Springs, CO, with friend Madeleine Vail. Madeleine encouraged him to keep after it. In 2009 he left his job at an advertising agency, started teaching appliqué and quilting, and never looked back. His teaching adventures have taken him around the globe and his quilted artworks hang in numerous private collections.

David Taylor is a two-time recipient of the Master Award for Contemporary Quilting from the International Quilt Association (2006, 2014), the Brother Wall Machine Workmanship Award from the American Quilters Society (Paducah Quilt Week, 2008), and a two-time Best of Show winner at the IQA's Spring Festival in Chicago (2007, 2008).


