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On <u>November 6, 2023</u>, at Shenendehowa United Methodist, we will have <u>Lisa Calle</u> returning with a lecture on how to design the quilting when finishing a pieced top. Last year, Lisa's feathers class was a big hit and this time, she will be teaching ruler quilt work. Lisa Calle is a long-armer, a Bernina Ambassador and Award-Winning quilter! With her humor and down to earth attitude, she will share with you her personal and professional journey of quilting. Lisa illustrates how she has earned renowned success from her initial piece using a "3%" seam allowance, to her latest quilt that won awards at the

Houston International Quilt Festival. As you gain insight on Lisa's amazing craft and her 3-step **Divide and Design** method, any hesitation you have regarding the patience or talent for quilting will quickly disappear. So, if you doubt whether you can quilt with pride, Lisa will give you the confidence and knowledge to start.

Divide and Design, Get it Done! Workshop

Do you feel overwhelmed when gazing upon a quilt feeling anxious that something creative and beautiful is beyond your scope? Have you observed pieces designed by quilters and thought "where do they come up with such originality?"

You are not alone, and the cure for such reluctance is just a class away. With Lisa's 3 step process you will approach the idea of quilting in a completely new way. Over the course of this class, you will divide large areas of your quilt into manageable small spaces, gaining the confidence and skill needed to produce a design that will make your quilt top sing and have you

smiling with pride! You will soon discover that anyone can transform the everyday quilt into a masterpiece, and moreover turn those special quilts into treasured heirlooms. So do not let Quilter's Agoraphobia keep you from doing what you love; let Lisa's class provide the freedom needed to bring out the quilter in you!

The Workshop will be on **November7** at the Elks Lodge, 695 MacElroy Road, Ballston Lake, NY. From 9:30 AM to 4PM (with a lunch break).

All Patriotic Quilts go to the McKenna Room at the Albany Airport for any Military men and women. Thanks a bunch for your help. Laura Swensen



President's Quilt Challenge

Due: December 4,2023 Mini Quilt – Smaller is Better

The challenge is to make something that is no more than 72 inches around its perimeter....so it could be an 18" square or a rectangle such as 16x20" or something round or oblong if it adds up to 72" or less around its outside border.

i.e.: 18"+18"+18"+18" = 72

16"+20"+16"+20" = 72"

10"+12"+10"+12"=44"

10"+33"+10"+33" = 86" too big

For a circle (Diameter = 22") x 3.14 = 69"

This is a great opportunity to try something you have been thinking about or just a little something extra for a table or wall. Have fun and be creative as you take on this Mini Quilt Challenge.

Krista Moser is the creative force and inspiration behind Krista Moser, The Quilted





SUPPLY LIST – PATRIOTIC SEW ALONG 11/11/23

10" SQUARES - You can cut fabric from yardage or use a Layer Cake -20, 30, 40 or more; Layer Cake has 42 - 10" squares. RED, WHITE, BLUE, AND GOLD colors of all shades.

<u>GEQUILTDESIGN.com</u> for your "KIMBERLY" PDF pattern for \$10 (optional) but very helpful. KIMBERLY pattern is also in Stripology 3 book. Picture below is "Kimberly" quilt.

<u>PATSLOAN.com</u> for your "OH MY STARS" free pattern, look for Fun Pages Free Patterns on her home page, then scroll down to find the pattern and print. If you want to add to make a Queen or King size there is a \$5 fee for added directions. For the stars you will need yardage, check pattern. You will use 5" squares or cut the 10" squares and get four 5" squares.


SEWING MACHINE in good working order.

RULERS -6% x 12 % - a Square Ruler at least 12-12 %, 6 % x 24 1/2 or Stripology Squared Ruler or the XL Stripology Ruler or the Squared Stripology Ruler, (Stripology rulers are optional but very helpful), a GE Design product.

Mat, Rotary Cutter with new blade, thread, and general sewing supplies. A Frixion pen or a marking pen or pencil will be very helpful. Small **iron** with ironing mat. Extension cord BRING YOUR LUNCH!
