On **October 2, 2023**, our guild will host **David Taylor** – here is one of his recent works - Isn't it stunning!



Our own Angela Pachal took David's class and won a ribbon at the Vermont Quilt Show with a portrait of her dog!

David Taylor currently lives in Fort Collins, Colorado. His obsession with fabric began at an early age, salvaging tiny scraps from his mother's sewing area trash bin. He started creating on her sewing machine by age 10. After college, he began a 30-plus-year career in graphic design. His first quilt design was in 1999, collaborating on a fundraiser project for Strings Music Festival in Steamboat Springs, CO, with friend Madeleine Vail. Madeleine encouraged him to keep after it. In 2009 he left his job at an advertising agency, started teaching appliqué and quilting, and never looked back. His teaching adventures have taken him around the globe and his quilted artworks hang in numerous private collections.

David Taylor is a two-time recipient of the Master Award for Contemporary Quilting from the International Quilt Association (2006, 2014), the Brother Wall Machine Workmanship Award from the American Quilters Society (Paducah Quilt Week, 2008), and a two-time Best of Show winner at the IQA's Spring Festival in Chicago (2007, 2008).

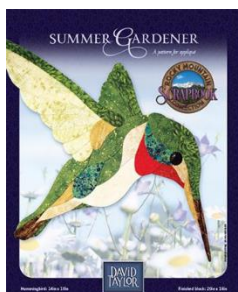

President's Quilt Challenge

Due: December 4, 2023

Mini Quilt – Smaller is Better

The challenge is to make something that is no more than 72 inches around its perimeter....so it could be an 18" square or a rectangle such as 16x20" or something round or oblong if it adds up to 72" or less around its outside border.

i.e.: $18''+18''+18''+18'' = 72$

$16''+20''+16''+20'' = 72''$

$10''+12''+10''+12''=44''$

$10''+33''+10''+33'' = 86''$ too big

For a circle (Diameter = 22") $\times 3.14 = 69''$

This is a great opportunity to try something you have been thinking about or just a little something extra for a table or wall. Have fun and be creative as you take on this Mini Quilt Challenge.

May 7, 2024 Workshop – David Sirota

David tells us:

“I have been quilting since the late 90’s (that’s 1990’s) after my friend Amy Fitzpatrick taught me the basics of quilting. And I thank “Simply Quilts” for all of the information and instruction that Alex Anderson and her guests provided. It felt like I was going to quilting school, and I tried not to miss a class.

There was one technique that I was immediately drawn to, and that was paper piecing. I thought it was so cool because of the intricate and accurate results you get. The only drawback was that it was really difficult to wrap my brain around, kinda like upside down and backwards. If you’ve ever tried it, you know what I mean. But once I got it, the results were quite exciting. Except, there were a couple of huge drawbacks...how to orient the next piece of fabric, and removing the paper. Regardless of the kind of paper I used, it still had to be removed at the end, which took as long or longer than the construction of the quilt!

So, I started thinking about how to make paper piecing simpler and faster. And I’m proud to say that in 2004, I figured it out. My “Sirota No More Tears Paper Piecing” © method is easier to understand and takes half the time of the old way of paper piecing.”

David Sirota will be presenting a workshop on May 7, 2024, demonstrating his paper piecing technique with the NH Beauty. Sign up link to follow.

SUPPLY LIST – PATRIOTIC SEW ALONG 11/11/23

10" SQUARES - You can cut fabric from yardage or use a Layer Cake – 20, 30, 40 or more; Layer Cake has 42 – 10" squares. RED, WHITE, BLUE, AND GOLD colors of all shades.

GEQUILTDESIGN.com for your “**KIMBERLY**” PDF pattern for \$10 (optional) but very helpful. KIMBERLY pattern is also in Stripology 3 book.

PATSLOAN.com for your “**OH MY STARS**” free pattern, look for Fun Pages Free Patterns on her home page, then scroll down to find the pattern and print. If you want to add to make a Queen or King size there is a \$5 fee for added directions. For the stars you will need yardage, check pattern. You will use 5" squares or cut the 10" squares and get four 5" squares.

SEWING MACHINE in good working order.

RULERS – 6 ½ x 12 ½ - a Square Ruler at least 12-12 ½, 6 ½ x 24 1/2 or Stripology Squared Ruler or the XL Stripology Ruler or the Squared Stripology Ruler, (Stripology rulers are optional but very helpful), a GE Design product.

Mat, Rotary Cutter with new blade, thread, and general sewing supplies. A Frixion pen or a marking pen or pencil will be very helpful. Small **iron** with ironing mat. Extension cord

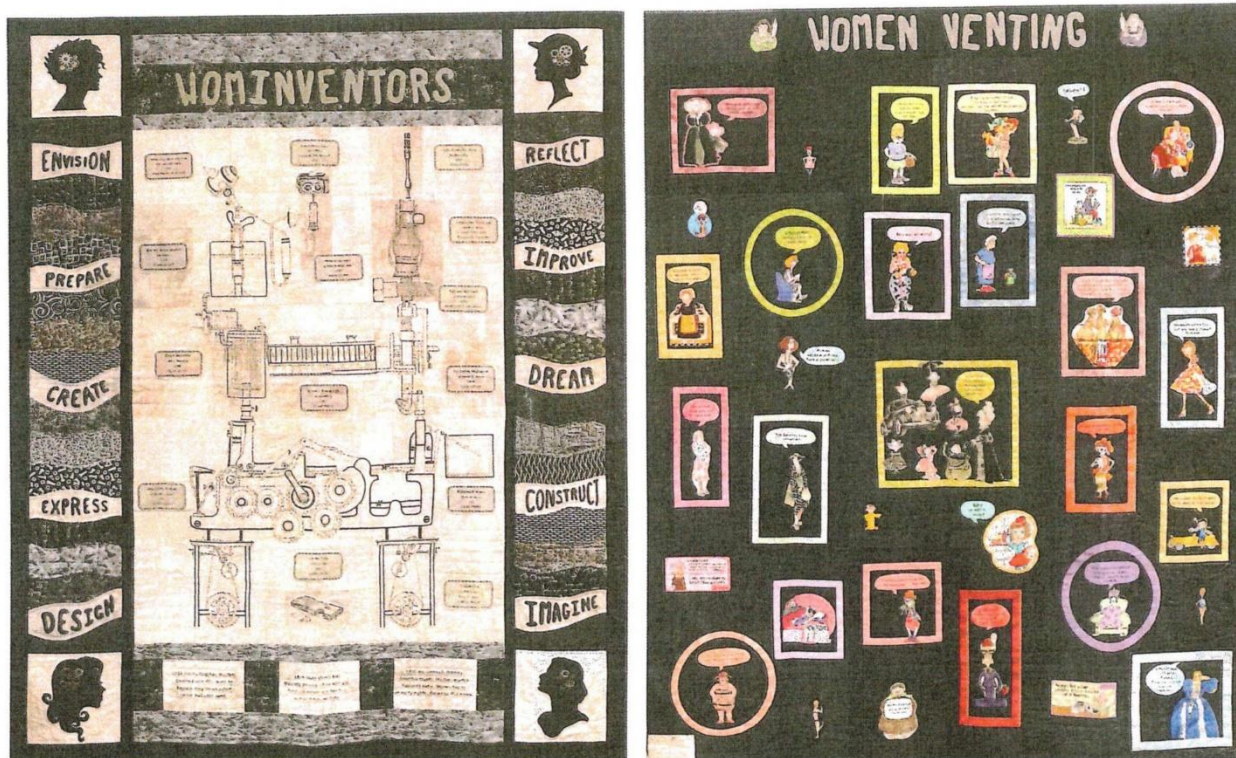
