Many thanks to the family of Judy Sturgis for donating her fabric stash to QUILT North. We will be able to make many nice Comfort Quilts from her beautiful fabric.

We are acquiring two long tables and risers to facilitate kit and sandwich making at Diane Smith's home. Diane is housing the guild's stash and working with kit makers and sandwich makers. Sherri Walczak is now working with the guild library and Charlotte Dugan has taken the helm as Comfort Quilt team leader. SOOOOO—we need a few more people to join the team.

Kit makers assemble quilt kits for members to take home and sew, bringing back completed quilt tops. Sandwich makers take those completed tops, add backing and batting so that guild members can quilt or tie and bind the quilts. Finished quilts are returned to the team and Deb Kreifels delivers them to several worthwhile organizations.

**April 8– Linda Warren** from Queensbury NY with her curved piecing patterns and designs!

Tuesday, April 9, 2024

All levels of quilters with basic machine piecing skills can make this stunning illusion of overlapping squares and circles. The curved units that create the "moons" are made with The Learning Curve ruler. In this workshop, you will learn how to use The Learning Curve, learn how to sew curves with free-form curved piecing, and get help planning your quilt layout. We will use the design wall to discover how different fabric combinations create different visual effects. You will learn how to make an



optional curvy pieced border. Quilt size: no border 44" x 44", with plain border 48" x 48", with curvy border 52" x 52"  $\,$ 

Level: Advanced Beginner with basic machine piecing skills.

Required: The Learning Curve, Over the Moon pattern.

May~6-David~Sirota~ "I have been quilting since the late 90's (that's1990's) after my friend Amy Fitzpatrick taught me the basics of quilting. And I thank "Simply Quilts" for all the information and instruction that Alex Anderson and her guests provided. It felt like I was going to quilting school, and I tried not to miss a class.

There was one technique that I was immediately drawn to, and that was paper piecing. I thought it was so cool because of the intricate and accurate results you get. The only drawback was that it was really difficult to wrap my brain around, kinda like upside down and backwards. If you've ever tried it, you know what I mean. But once I got it, the results were quite exciting. Except, there were a couple of huge drawbacks...how to orient the next piece of fabric, and removing the paper. Regardless of the kind of paper I used, it still had to be removed at the end, which took as long or longer than the construction of the quilt!

So, I started thinking about how to make paper piecing simpler and faster. And I'm proud to say that in 2004, I figured it out. My "Sirota No More Tears Paper Piecing" © method is easier to understand and takes half the time of the old way of paper piecing."
